State Council Representation Elections and CCTC Applications

There are 3 positions for State Council Representatives for 2025-2026. As a State Council Representative, you will attend the 4 <u>CTA State Council</u> meetings acting on the behalf of the needs of CTA Aspiring Educators. State Delegates are elected by secret ballot sent to all CTA-AE members.

State Council Representation Election Timeline:

- April 28, 2025 by 4PM deadline to declare for the State Council via the <u>Declaration of Candidacy Form</u>
- May 5, 2025 voting will begin on election buddy
- May 12, 2025 voting will end on election buddy at 11:59 PM
- May 20, 2025 results will be shared with members and submitted to CTA Elections Committee
- May 30, 2025 deadline to file challenges

CTA-AE Scholarships, Grants, and Awards

2024-2025 CTA/NEA-Retired Pedretti Credential Candidate Scholarship

Deadline: May 17, 2025

Dedicated to Gloria's former students, this scholarship will provide financial aid to potential educators pursuing a Pre-K through 12th grade teaching credential through an accredited institution of higher education.

LGBTQ+ Safety in Schools Grant & Scholarship Program in Honor of Guy DeRosa

Deadline: May 30, 2025

The grant program will support groups, projects and presentations that promote understanding of and respect for LGBTQ+ persons. In addition, the scholarship program will support self-identified LGBTQ+ active CTA/CTA Aspiring Educators members enrolled in a teacher/counseling credential or graduate program who are pursuing a career in public education and who understand the importance of LGBTQ+ educators as role models in our public schools.
