Since 1863

When CTA was founded in 1863, only a few hundred students attended public schools and staff were underpaid and needed more resources. Within three years, CTA persuaded the state legislature to establish free public schools for all children.

We've had many victories since then-from winning Proposition 98, the landmark state constitutional amendment that guarantees a certain amount of the state's budget for K-14 schools; to winning the establishment of community colleges and the CalPERS, the largest educator-only pension fund in the world; to securing critical resources for our schools with Propositions 30 and 55 and the recent Social Security Fairness Act that repealed the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and Government Pension Offset (GPO).

Together, we have improved the working conditions and salaries of Education Support Professionals and expanded the opportunity for California's students to receive a quality education.
