This month we feature a celebration of Black history and culture as well as efforts to advance community schooling across the state and nation.

From the College Center to the Capitol



Jonathan Oyaga is an educational aide at the UCLA Community School, working in the College and Career Center to support students' postsecondary transitions. He also serves on the National Education Association's Board of Directors, representing aspiring educators in California and across the nation. This month, Jonathan spent a busy weekend in Washington DC, attending the NEA Board meeting and visiting the offices of Representatives Schiff, Waters, and Pelosi to talk with them about the power of community schools.

He shared the Research-Practice Partnership he helps lead as a research associate with the UCLA Center for Community Schooling—a multi-year effort to improve first generation BIPOC students' journey to and through college. At the request of Representative Schiff's office, he also expressed the school's concern that students of mixed status families are currently unable to complete the FAFSA due to recent changes—insights that were included in a letter the office was drafting to the Department of Education. We applaud Jonathan's efforts to advocate for policies and practices that advance culturally sustaining community schools.
