We can't wait: All students deserve a well-rounded and joyful education in environments that promote high quality education. This means smaller class sizes and access to school counselors, nurses, and mental health professionals.

SAFE & STABLE SCHOOLS FOR OUR STUDENTS & COMMUNITIES

We can't wait: It's simple: our students deserve more resources, not less. Yet 2,000 educators were threatened with layoff notices in 2024. Layoffs, cuts, and school closures disproportionately harm our most vulnerable students and bring chaos to our school communities. Our students and school communities deserve robust and stable funding. We are going to fight for the stability our students deserve.

COMPETITIVE WAGES AND BENEFITS

We can't wait: We have an educator recruitment and retention crisis with thousands of vacancies across California. Choosing public education as a career used to come with the promise of being able to own a home, raise a family, and thrive in our communities. Today, educators are struggling to pay the rent and often work more than one job to make ends meet. It's time for pay and benefits to reflect the critical role we have in our society.

Educators deserve a living wage in the communities they serve.
