

Why I'm Voting NO on the RECALL

This special election is a waste of taxpayer money:

This recall is costing taxpayers \$276 million when the next scheduled election is only a year away.

Recalls should be used when an elected official has committed a crime or major ethical abuse, not just because some people are unable to accept their election losses.

This costly recall is supported by the same groups that want to dismantle public education and labor unions. They have filed a voucher initiative that would take money from public schools and funnel it to private schools.

Gov. Newsom has prioritized school safety and recovery:

Gov. Newsom prioritized vaccines for essential workers, educators and school staff, and now California has one of the lowest COVID-19 transmission rates in the country and is leading the nation's economic recovery, creating more jobs than any other state for four consecutive months.

Gov. Newsom expanded transitional kindergarten to all 4-year-olds to help give students a promising start to a bright future.

Gov. Newsom provided historic funding for K-12 schools and community colleges in the state budget, including money to help schools open safely and hire counselors and nurses

Gov. Newsom strongly supports labor unions and working families. His efforts led to pay raises for child care workers and other essential workers on the front lines during the pandemic.

How will the recall election work?

All California voters will receive a ballot in the mail with two questions: Will the Governor be recalled, and who will replace him?

If a majority vote yes on the recall, the candidate with the most votes becomes California's new Governor.

It is possible for the winner to receive less than 50% of the votes.

By Mail: Mail-in ballots must be postmarked by Sept. 14.

Drop Off: Drop off your mail-in ballot at any time at your county elections office, any vote center, polling place, or ballot drop-off location by 8:00 PM on Sept. 14.
