Art & Music in Schools

Prop 28 helps bring back the arts!

Prop 28 dedicates nearly \$1 billion a year in additional funding for arts and music education in PreK-12 public schools – without raising taxes.

- Every public school in every school district will receive increased funding for arts and music education so every student benefits.
- Schools serving children in low-income communities are allocated additional needed funding.
- Funding must be spent on arts and music education on teachers, supplies, arts partnerships, training and materials.

In addition to traditional arts and music classes, Prop 28 includes funding for contemporary arts like graphic design, computer graphics, and film and video.

Prop 28 includes strick accountability and transparency provisions!

- Prohibits Legislature or school districts from using the funds for other purposes.
- Requires annual audits of the funding.
- Requires schools to publish annual reports on how they spend funds, including the specific programs and how students benefited.
