Initiatives

YES on Prop 1

Reproductive Freedom

Provides women equal access to health care services and prohibits the state from denying an individual's right to reproductive freedom.

YES on Prop 28

Art & Music in Schools

Ensures every student in every TK-12 public school in California has access to arts and music education. An additional \$1billion each year without raising taxes. At least 80 percent of the funding must be used to hire additional staff.

YES on Prop 31

Stop Big Tobacco Referendum

Supports referendum to protect current law which bans the sale of flavored tobacco products and marketing to teens.

No on Prop 27

Online & Mobile Sports Betting

Legalizes online and mobile sports betting in California. Online gambling corporations would take 90% of the profits out of state. Not a single penny is directed to our students or our state's public schools.

No on Prop 30

Lyft Special Interest Tax


