How to run the CTA Engagement Survey Results report						
Follow these simple steps to generate the report:						
 Log into MyFalcon/Falcon/CTA 360Pro Navigate to the organization profile you would like to run survey results for If you are a CTA 360Pro user, simply click on the Reports icon from the homepage, skip step 3 						
3. Click on the report icon 💷 located in the upper right-hand corner of the screen						
4. Select "CTA Engagement Survey Results" from the reports list						
5. A Report Parameters screen will appear. Select from the following options: CTA Engagement Survey Results(Org Profile)

How to analyze your CTA Engagement survey results

Make the most of your engagement survey data by utilizing these tips:

- 1. Always keep a hard copy of the engagement survey questionnaire handy when generating the survey results. This will assist in evaluating the most commonly selected topics of interest or concern
- 2. The report output contains the following demographic fields: First Name, Last Name, Primary Email, Primary Phone, Local, Work Location, Membership Type, CTA Category, Membership Start, CDD, NDD, Region, SCC, and UniServ. Utilize the sorting feature in Excel to evaluate your results by a specific demographic. For example, to sort by building site, simply click on the "Work Location" header, then click on the sorting icon. This will allow you to determine the topics of interest or concern, by work site.

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3. The report also includes each member's answers to the survey questions. A "Y" indicates that the individual selected the option as something they have interest in. To sort by a specific survey answer, navigate to the appropriate survey question in the Excel file, and click on the letter you want to sort by. For example, if you want to see who selected the first option under Question 2, navigate to Q2 in the spreadsheet, and click on "A". Then, select the sorting icon
