#### CTA Institute for Teaching

- The *Institute for Teaching* (IFT) works to support teaching and learning in California classrooms and promotes teacher leadership to ensure that our members have a voice in school improvement.
- The IFT's Grant Program funds strength-based, member-created projects from pre-K to Higher Education and over \$6.7 million in grants has been awarded to CTA members since 2010.
- The IFT advocates for teacher-driven solutions to increase graduation rates, expand parental involvement, promote universal preschool, and close achievement gaps.
