## YES on PROP. 30

Over the past 4 years California schools and colleges have been cut more than \$20 billion. We can't keep cutting education and keep the economy strong. We have to stop the cuts and stop the tuition hikes.

**Prop. 30 will stop another \$6 billion in cuts to our schools and colleges this year.** It provides additional funding for education and public safety by asking the wealthiest Californians to pay a little more so the middle class doesn't have to bear the burden.

Prop. 30 guarantees that the money goes into a special account for local schools that can't be touched by Sacramento politicians. None of the money can be spent on administrative costs or bureaucracy. And Prop. 30 requires independent audits every year so voters know the money is spent properly.

We must invest in our schools and colleges to prepare the next generation for the jobs of the future.

## NO on PROP. 32

Prop. 32 is NOT what it seems.

Prop. 32 claims to stop campaign spending by special interests. But then you find out the exact same corporate special interests who are supporting Prop. 32 have exempted themselves.

**Prop. 32 was intentionally written to create special exemptions** for big oil companies, Wall Street, billionaires and those secretive campaign Super PACs that want to rig the system while the middle class pays the price.

Described as a "fraud" and a "sham" by California newspapers, **Prop. 32 gives its billionaire backers more power, while limiting the voices of teachers, nurses and firefighters** and their ability to fight cuts to our schools and public safety and oppose unfair corporate tax giveaways.

It's unbalanced and unfair, and it hurts all of us.
