

Prop. 32: It's Not What It Seems



Prop. 32 was intentionally written to create special exemptions for billionaire businessmen, giving them even more power to write their own set of rules. Prop. 32 will not take money out of politics. It exempts secretive Super PACs, which can raise unlimited amounts of money from corporate special interests and billionaire businessmen to support their candidates or defeat their enemies. And it does nothing to stop anonymous donors from influencing elections.

What's more, corporations already outspend labor 15 to 1 on political expenditures!

Proposition 32:

- Silences the voices of faculty, teachers, nurses and firefighters and takes away our ability to speak out on important issues—like cuts to our colleges and schools, police and fire response times, workplace safety, consumer protections, homeowner rights and unfair corporate giveaways.
- Takes away the ability of faculty unions from contributing to elect educationfriendly trustees and participating in parcel tax and bond elections.
- Makes it so secretive super PACs become the law of the land.
- Is part of a "one-two" punch. First they take away our power. Then they go after our working conditions and benefits, and even strip us of collective bargaining rights.

Unions have fought hard to win the rights that benefit us all. Under Prop. 32, the minimum wage, health programs and the social safety net would be under attack.
