

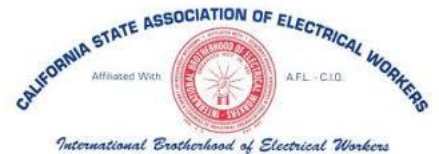

For years there has been a critical need to revamp laws governing charter schools. There is a need to return to the original intent of California's charter school law to have local parents, educators and communities make these decisions. A vote for this bill promotes the value that the primary function of charter schools is to establish locally-driven pedagogical innovation that supports California's system of public education and does not replace or undermine it. The current regulatory framework for charter schools is not promoting this value. 




