


Start Collecting...CTA Timeline

1863

CTA founded as California Educational Society by Superintendent of Public Instruction John Swett.

1866

CTA's first legislative achievement establishes free public schools for all children in California.

1867

CTA is the only major organization in California to denounce the practice of segregating African American and Asian American students in separate schools. CTA fights for and wins public funding for schools that educate nonwhite students.

1890

CTA wins state Supreme Court ruling on "fair dismissal" law.

1895

CTA-sponsored class size legislation sets the maximum class size at 80 students.
